"Charmed, I'm Sure" **Quilt Pattern**



Quilt is 40½" × 40½"

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

- 1 Moda Charm Pack or (40) 5" squares
- 1¼ yards Background or (2) Bella Solids Charm Packs (24 squares will be leftover)
- 3/8 yard Binding
- 2¾ yards Backing
- 50" × 50" Batting

CUTTING -

- 1. From the Charm Pack:
 - Select (24) squares to make Half Square Triangle (HST) units and set aside.
 - Select (16) squares and trim each to $4\frac{1}{2}$ " × $4\frac{1}{2}$ ".
- 2. From the background fabric:
 - Cut (3) 5" × WOF strips. Subcut (20) 5" × 5" squares.
 - Cut **(5)** 4½" × WOF strips. Subcut **(40)** 4½" × 4½" squares.
- 3. From the binding fabric:
 - Cut **(5)** 21/4" × WOF strips and sew the strips end to end to make the binding.

INSTRUCTIONS -


Use 1/4" seam allowance. RST = right sides together.

- 1. Make HST units.
 - Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of (20)
 5" background squares and (2) printed Charm squares.
 - Layer a marked 5" square and a printed Charm square RST.
 - Sew a 1/4" seam allowance on each side of the drawn line and cut apart on the drawn line.
 - Press toward dark fabric.
 - Trim to $4\frac{1}{2}$ " × $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square.
 - Repeat to make a total of **(40)** background/print HSTs and **(4)** print/print HSTs.










2. Lay out **(40)** background 4½" squares,

(40) background/print HSTs, **(16)** 4½" print squares, and **(4)** print/print HSTs, as shown. Sew into 10 rows; press even rows to one side and odd rows to the other side, allowing the seams to nest nicely. Join the rows and press seams open.



3. Layer quilt top, batting, and backing. Quilt and bind using preferred methods. Simple straight line quilting on either side of each row and column seam line works beautifully for this pattern.
